

## ROSTER OF THE STURGEONS IN THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR

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(Compiled from Records by Mrs. Mary Sturgeon and John C. Sturgeon, Erie, Pennsylvania.)

PRIVATE SAMUEL STURGEON, in Captain James Murry's Company, of the 4th Battalion of Lancaster County, Associators, Colonel James Burd, Commander, and went into active service in November or December, 1775, and participated in battles of Trenton and Princeton. Return, as per Muster Roll of March 13, 1776.—Pa. Arch. 2nd. Ser. Vol. 13, pp. 310-311.

Samuel Sturgeon took oath of Allegiance in Hanover Township, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, March 4, 1778.—Pa. Arch. 2nd. Ser. Vol. 13, p. 407.
